# CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

## Isaiah 65:17-25



# LITURGY OF GENEROSITY


- P: We have a generous God! We give thanks to the Lord for all He has given us.

## PROCLAMATION OF CHRIST


- P: As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death and resurrection until He comes.




If you have not taken communion with us before, please read our communion statement in the back of the bulletin before joining us in this sacrament.

## ABOUT COMMUNION

First Lutheran Church and Preschool celebrates the Lord's Supper every Sunday in the joyful confidence that Christ our Lord gives us not only bread and wine but His very body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. The Lord's Supper is intended for Christians who have been baptized, instructed in the faith, and who believe in these words of Christ: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." Anyone who is not baptized or does not believe these words should refrain from participating in the Lord's Supper as our participation is a confession of our common faith.

Anyone who has not been instructed in the faith or holds a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desires to receive the Lord's Supper, is asked first to speak with the pastor. For further study, see 1 Corinthians 11:17-34 (pages 958-959 in the English pew Bibles). Those not receiving the Lord's Supper (both adults and children) are invited to come forward for a blessing.
