

RITE OF BAPTISM

- P: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- P: Dearly beloved, Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." And the apostle Peter has written, "Baptism now saves you."
- P: Sawyer, receive the sign of the holy cross both upon your # forehead and upon your # heart to mark you as one redeemed by Christ the crucified.
- P: Let us pray.

Almighty and eternal God, according to Your strict judgment You condemned the unbelieving world through the flood, yet according to Your great mercy You preserved believing Noah and his family, eight souls in all. You drowned hard-hearted Pharaoh and all his host in the Red Sea, yet led Your people Israel through the water on dry ground, foreshadowing this washing of Your Holy Baptism. Through the Baptism in the Jordan of Your beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, You sanctified and instituted all waters to be a blessed flood and a lavish washing away of sin.

We pray that You would behold Sawyer according to Your boundless mercy and bless him with true faith by the Holy Spirit, that through this saving flood all sin in him would be drowned and die. Grant that he be kept safe and secure in the holy ark of the Christian Church, serving Your name at all times with a joyful hope, so that, with all believers in Your promise, he would receive eternal life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

- C: Amen.
- P: From ancient times the Church has observed the custom of appointing sponsors for those being baptized. Sponsors are to confess the faith expressed in the Apostles' Creed and are, whenever possible, to witness the Baptism of those they sponsor. Sponsors are to pray for those being baptized and support them in their ongoing instruction and nurture in the Christian faith. They are at all times to be examples to them of the holy life of faith in Christ and love for the neighbor.
- P: Sponsors, is it your intention to serve Sawyer as sponsors in the Christian faith?
- R: Yes, with the help of God.
- P: God enable you to will and to do this faithful and loving work and with His grace fulfill what we are unable to do.
- C: Amen.

- P: The congregation will now answer for Sawyer the following questions:
- P: Do you renounce the devil?
- C: Yes, I renounce him.
- P: Do you renounce all his works?
- C: Yes, I renounce them.
- P: Do you renounce all his ways?
- C: Yes, I renounce them.
- P: Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth?
- C: Yes, I believe.
- P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord?
- C: Yes, I believe.
- P: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?
- C: Yes, I believe.

Sawyer is baptized into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

He will receive a white garment and a burning light that will serve as reminders of his baptism.

- P: In Holy Baptism, God the Father has made you a member of His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, and heir with us of all the treasures of heaven in the one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We receive you in Jesus' name as our brother in Christ, that together we might hear His Word, receive His gifts, and proclaim the praises of Him who called us out of darkness into His marvelous light.
- C: Amen. We welcome you Sawyer in the name of the Lord.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P: In the name of the Father and of the 4 Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- P: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.

The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the LORD shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be lifted up above the hills; and all the nations shall flow to it, and many peoples shall come, and say: "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD.

R: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

EPISTLE

Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.

Besides this you know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light.

HOLY GOSPEL Matthew 24:36-44

P: The Holy Gospel, according to St. Matthew, the twenty-fourth chapter.

But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only. As were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two men will be in the field; one will be taken and one left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken and one left. Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.


PROCLAMATION OF CHRIST



ABOUT COMMUNION

First Lutheran Church and Preschool celebrates the Lord's Supper every Sunday in the joyful confidence that Christ our Lord gives us not only bread and wine but His very body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. The Lord's Supper is intended for Christians who have been baptized, instructed in the faith, and who believe in these words of Christ: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." Anyone who is not baptized or does not believe these words should refrain from participating in the Lord's Supper as our participation is a confession of our common faith.

Anyone who has not been instructed in the faith or holds a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desires to receive the Lord's Supper, is asked first to speak with the pastor. For further study, see 1 Corinthians 11:17-34 (pages 958-959 in the English pew Bibles). Those not receiving the Lord's Supper (both adults and children) are invited to come forward for a blessing.
